

Serving our Community



We provide cost-effective, comprehensive healthcare services to ensure everyone has access to high-quality care. As a community-run and community-driven health center, all are welcome at RRCC.

With four clinic locations, our direct service area spans from Watertown to Whitewater, encompassing 13 zip codes from Jefferson, Dodge & Walworth Counties.

In 2023, we served 2,984 patients for a total of 7,642 visits between our medical and dental clinics, with 93% of our patients residing in our designated service area.

All RRCC clinics accept Badgercare and offer a Sliding Fee Discount Program for patients who are uninsured or underinsured (high deductible plan) with limited financial resources. Our medical clinics also accept Medicare and many commercial carriers which, like Badgercare, further helps offset the write-offs for patients enrolled in our Sliding Fee Discount Program.

Federally Qualified Health Center - Look-Alike

2023 marked our first year as a Federally Qualified Health Center under the Look-Alike (FQHC-LAL) designation, starting with our medical clinics. The FQHC-LAL status provides significant support for the sustainability of our services and the provision of high-quality, affordable care options for families throughout our region.

Benefits of the status include, but are not limited to:

- Higher reimbursement for Medicaid/BadgerCare and Medicare patient services
- Access to the Vaccines for Children program (federal vaccine program)
- Loan forgiveness program through the National Healthcare Service Corps program

RRCC is the only rural FQHC-LAL in Wisconsin and maintains a patient volume equal to similar-sized FQHCs.



To move past our "Look-Alike" designation, Congress must approve increased federal appropriations to community health centers. HRSA (Health Resources and Services Administration) then needs to release New Access Point Funding for LALs like RRCC to apply for and receive. We eagerly await the news!

Hispanic/Latino Support

In 2023, the number of patients at our medical clinics who identified as Hispanic/Latino grew to 80%.

To ensure effective communication with our Hispanic/Latino patients, we are proud to have 12 full-time bilingual staff members (48% of all full-time staff) and offer all materials in both English & Spanish.

ROCK RIVER

RRCC provides primary medical care for adults, children, and infants.



In 2023, we saw a 45% increase in patient visits from 2022 and a 29% increase in unique patient count.

Reducing Barriers to Care - Integrated Behavioral Health

In June 2023, we officially began offering Behavioral Health Services integrated through our medical clinics, offering screening and support for depression, anxiety, substance abuse, and more.

Our Behavioral Health provider offers in-person and video appointments via telehealth to discuss treatment options and provide short-term counseling and support.

RRCC's Behavioral Health team facilitates referrals to community resources and partners for longer-term therapy and/or medication support.





In our first six months, we provided 79 behavioral health visits, including 14 telehealth visits.

Measurably Reducing Health Disparities

Thanks to Fort HealthCare's Population Health Department, we have leveraged the benefits of our shared Electronic Medical Record to compare various quality measures between FHC and RRCC populations. Embedded within our monthly reporting, our disparity tracking dashboard helps us monitor six key health indicators to measurably improve health outcomes in our shared community. Thank you to Fort Healthcare for their support & partnership in reducing health disparities in our community!





At RRCC in 2023, we identifiably:

- Improved completion of colorectal cancer screenings by 24% and cervical cancer screenings by 11%, reducing the disparity between RRCC and FHC by 12.2% points and 19.3% points, respectively.
- Increased the number of diabetic patients with resting blood pressure <u>below</u> 140/90 from 67% to 80%, reducing the disparity between RRCC and FHC from 13.1% to 0.3%.
- Reduced the disparity between RRCC and FHC for diabetic patients with A1c < 8% from 23% to 18%.

Prescription Assistance Program

Through the Prescription Assistance Program, we help provide financially-eligible patients with access to free medications directly from pharmaceutical manufacturers. Once enrolled, medications ranging from \$60 inhalers to \$2,000/month insulins are received at no cost to the patient for at least one year.

- Crowns





RRCC continues to serve as the <u>only</u> dental clinic in Jefferson County that accepts patients enrolled in BadgerCare/Medicaid.





In 2023, we began offering nitrogen oxide to help relieve dental pain and anxiety during dental procedures, an asset for our clinical team and families in supporting pediatric care.

Integrating Oral Care and Healthcare

In an effort to address the risks associated with hypertension, our RRCC dental clinic follows American Dental Association (ADA) recommendations in taking blood pressure readings during all new patients exams and once a year during follow-up hygiene cleaning appointments.





Renovated Dental Lobby

Thank you to the AAUW of Fort Atkinson for their generous support in renovating our patient lobby at our Fort Atkinson dental clinic.

Through a grant award from the Fort Atkinson Community Foundation, the AAUW team transformed the space through carpet cleaning, painting, adding new furnishings & wall art painted by Fort Atkinson

Revenue & Expenses

In 2023, RRCC wrote off over \$1.37 million in medical and dental patient service expenses, a cost that is only sustainable due to the generosity of our community partners and local foundations, such as Fort HealthCare, Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation, Watertown Regional Medical Center, Jefferson County Health and Human Services Departments and many more. RRCC also receives critical revenue from generous local business donors, individual givers, community outreach, and our annual Tour da Goose fundraiser.


With a general operating loss of \$1.36 million, non-operating revenue (i.e., grants revenue and donations) play a critical role in sustaining the care we can provide.


